

Minor Myers Jr. Personal Conduct of Life Collection

The Conduct of Life Collection consists of works related to moral instruction to youth as well as advice to housewives and mothers from the 16th to the 20th Centuries. These books are located in the Ames Library Tate Archives & Special Collections on the **fourth floor** and are **not available for checkout**. The books may be consulted in the Archives Reading Room. Tate Archives & Special Collections' hours can be accessed by navigating to the Library Homepage, selecting the "Contact" tab and clicking on "Tate Archives" from the drop-down list.

Search for all titles in the collection:

1. Go to <<http://www.iwu.edu/library/>>
2. In the "Home" tab, click on the link that reads "Ames Catalog" under the Designation "Other Catalogs."
