- Students should follow the Associates in Arts degree at CCC as opposed to the Associates in Science degree. The AA degree includes the Gen Ed Certificate, which is a complete package of transferable General Education Core Courses (GECC).
- At least one course must meet the Human Diversity (HD) requirement. This is a graduation requirement for CCC.
- At City College of Chicago, choose a (G) Global Diversity and a (U) US Diversity course from recommended list to meet IWU graduation requirements. **Global diversity options:** ANTHRO 202, HIST 215, HIST 212, 247, HUM 215, MUS 183, POL SCI 204, SOC 210, SPANISH 104. **US Diversity options:** HIST 111, 112, 114, 115, 216, HUM 107, POL SCI 201, SOC 207.
- AP scores of 3, 4 and 5 will receive 1 unit of credit. Higher level IB scores of 4 or higher will receive 1 unit of credit.
- Remedial math courses may be needed to prepare for the math requirement. However, remedial courses will not transfer to IWU. Adjust schedule and hour requirements accordingly to complete degree.
- The IWU Second Language requirement can be met by completing the intermediate level (XXXXX-103) course of any language or by earning a 4 or 5 on the AP exam in a second language. Visit the IWU website for information:

- Students should complete a minimum of 64 semester hours, not including remedial or Physical Education courses, at City Colleges of Chicago to be on track to complete their bachelor's degree in a total of four years.
- Students are required, at minimum, to complete 16 units of coursework at IWU including half of all major requirements.
- IWU Graduation requirements: 32 total courses and 32 total units with 9 courses and 9 units of upper level courses. (1 IWU unit = 4 semester hours)
