- Students should follow the Associates in Arts degree at CCC as opposed to the Associates in Science degree. The AA degree includes the Gen Ed Certificate, which is a complete package of transferable General Education Core Courses (GECC).
- AP scores of 3, 4 and 5 will receive 1 unit of credit. Standard level IB scores of 5 or higher will receive 1 unit of credit.
- Remedial math courses may be needed to prepare for the math requirement. However, remedial courses
  will not transfer to IWU. College Algebra, College Trigonometry, and Pre-Calculus are not transferable for
  credit. Adjust schedule and hour requirements accordingly to complete degree.
- The IWU Second Language requirement can be met by completing the intermediate level (103) course of any language or by earning a 4 or 5 on the AP exam in a second language. - Students should complete a minimum of 64 semester hours, not including remedial or Physical Education courses, at City Colleges of Chicago to be on track to complete their bachelor's degree in a total of four years.
- Students are required, at minimum, to complete 16 units of coursework at IWU including half of all major requirements.
- IWU Graduation requirements: 32 total courses and 32 total units with 9 courses and 9 units of upper level courses. (1 IWU unit = 4 semester hours) 2024-2025
