- When selecting elective courses please note: Pre-calculus, College Algebra and Trigonometry are not transferable for credit.
- This plan includes the courses students should complete by the end of their sophomore year in order to advance to junior and senior level coursework in the business major. These courses include; Composition, Calculus for Business, Macro and Micro Economics, Financial and Managerial Accounting, and Statistics.
- Students should follow the Associates in Arts degree at Harper as opposed to the Associates in Science degree. The AA degree includes the Gen Ed Certificate, which is a complete package of transferable General Education Core Courses (IAI).
- AP scores of 3, 4 and 5 will receive 1 unit of credit. Higher level IB scores of 4 or higher will receive 1 unit of credit.
- Remedial math courses may be needed to prepare for the math requirement. However, remedial courses will not transfer to IWU. Adjust schedule and hour requirements accordingly to complete degree.
- The IWU Second Language requirement can be met by completing the intermediate level (XXXXX-201) course of any language or by earning a 4 or 5 on the AP exam in a second language. Visit the IWU website for information: <https://www.iwu.edu/registrar/transfer-credit-faq.html>
- Students should complete a minimum of 64 semester hours, not including remedial or PE courses, at Harper College to be on track to complete their bachelor's degree in a total of four years.
- Students are required, at minimum, to complete 16 units of coursework at IWU including half of all major requirements.
- IWU Graduation requirements: 32 total courses and 32 total units with 9 courses and 9 units of upper level courses. (1 IWU unit = 4 semester hours)
