\*\*Students who have completed dual credit coursework and have already completed HCC courses listed in year one, should add coursework to make sure they complete at least 32 semester hours in the first year. Select one from each **group**, if possible: **IT courses:** HUMA 203, HUMA 250, INTL 113, PHIL 101, RELI 260, MUSI 160. **Or LIT courses:** LIT 111, 112, 114, 115, 116, 116, 117, 119, 121, 233. These courses will fulfill IWU gen ed requirements.

- AP scores of 3, 4, or 5 will receive 1 unit of credit. Standard level IB scores of 5 or higher will receive 1 unit of credit.
- Remedial math courses may be needed to prepare for the math requirement. However, the remedial course will not transfer to IWU. Adjust course schedule accordingly to complete degree.
- Students are required, at minimum, to complete 16 units of coursework at IWU including half of all major requirements.
- IWU graduation requirements: 32 total courses and 32 total units with 9 courses and 9 units of upper level (300/400) courses. (1 IWU unit = 4 semester hours)
